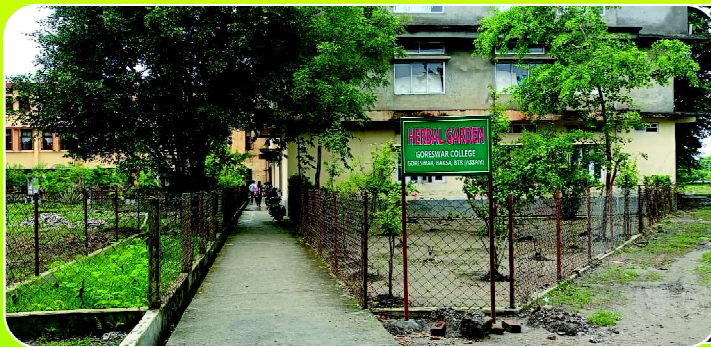

## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Goreswar College was established in 1974 by a team of selfless and untiring social workers and lovers of education of the greater Goreswar area and with the help of Betna Siksha and Krishi Unnayan Sangha (An Education and Agricultural Development Organisation). The College was brought under deficit system of grants-in-aid in 1981. Again the college was provincialised w.e.f. 1st February, 2005 by the Govt. of Assam along with other Deficit System of Grants-in-Aid Degree Colleges. The college has obtained inclusion under 2 (F) & 12(B) of the UGC Act. of 1956 vide UGC order no. F8-31/95(CPP-I) dated 8th April, 2003. At present the College has three streams- Arts, Commerce and Science. The present enrolment of the college is around 2000. At present it is under BTR (Bodoland Territorial Region). Goreswar College, thus, reflects the hopes and aspirations for Higher Education of the developing people of a geographically far-flung area to the South-East extreme of the District of Baksa. ## THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSES

The College is conducting Three Year Degree Course in Arts , Commerce and Science streams in Semester mode under Gauhati University. Admission to T.D.C. is open to those who have passed H.S. or equivalent examinations of other institutions recognized by the A.H.S.E.C. or equivalent Boards. The course is divided into two Sections (A & B) in Arts, Commerce and Science streams. Section A constitutes Honours Course and Section B constitutes Regular Course.

### The choice Based credit system (CBCS)

The Choice Based Credit System is the logical next step in a credit based semester system becoming more learner-centric. A CBCS offers the students a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the place, pace and time of learning. The UGC



has recommended that it is desirable for all institutions of Higher Education in the country to move to a CBCS and, together with it, implement a uniform grading system.

## **UNDER GRADUATE CBCS (UGCBCS) PROGRAMMES**

The undergraduate degree programme in the CBCS will have courses spreading across six-semester. A typical semester will comprise a minimum of 15 to 18 weeks of academic work that is 90 actual teaching days. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions- June to May) in normal situations. The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third and Fifth) shall be 'June to November', and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be 'December to May' again on the normal situations.

The dates and duration mentioned in the academic calendar concerned will be in consonance with the above schedule as far as practicable.

Each student must take admission in three consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enroll in the Second Academic Session will not be eligible to take admission in the Third Academic Session.

The minimum time requirement to acquire an undergraduate degree will be three years. The maximum time allowed to complete the programme will be six years.

The structure of Semester-I is given hereunder for the time being while the structures of the rest of the Semesters will be published in subsequent editions of the prospectus.

## SOME IMPORTANT POINTS

T.D.C. Semester System with Credit and Grades  
**Bodoland University**

### Duration :

A T.D.C. shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions — June to May). The overall duration of the semesters are given below. Odd Semesters (First, Third and Fifth): June to November & Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth): December to May. The dates and duration mentioned in the concerned Academic Calendar will be in consonance with the above schedule as far as practicable. Each student must take admission in three (3) consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enroll in 2nd Academic Session will not be eligible to take admission in 3rd Academic Session.



## Examinations :

Examinations, whether internal or external, theory or practical, would be conducted and counted separately for the purpose of considering a student as passed or failed.

## Rules :

1. If a student does not appear in a paper (internal or external, theory or practical) in an examination, the student will be considered as failed in the examination of that paper. Any failed paper will be called "Arrear".
2. In case, a student fails in any one or more papers in an end semester examinations/ he can appear in all the papers in which he/she has failed. Under no circumstances he/she will be allowed to re-appear in the "passed" paper(s).
3. A student having "Arrear" in external examination, either in theory or practical paper shall be allowed to clear the same in the next available end-semester examinations, with the following restrictions:
4. No student will be allowed to appear in the first and the fifth semester examinations simultaneously.
5. No student will be allowed to appear in the second and the sixth semester examinations simultaneously.
6. The first and the fifth semester examinations will be held simultaneously. The third semester examinations will be held separately. Similarly, the second and the sixth semester examinations will be held simultaneously. The fourth semester examinations will be held separately.
7. A student may be allowed once to "Re-appear" in any one of the major theory papers in the first, the second and the third semester examination for betterment of marks if the candidate secured pass marks in all papers. Students will be allowed to "Re-appear" only in the next similar examination. Whichever is the higher mark obtained between the earlier or in the subsequent examination, will be awarded to the student.
8. No "betterment" shall be allowed in the internal/ practical examinations in any Semester.
9. A student must pass all her/his semester examinations, including "arrear" and "betterment" chances within six years from the date of admission to the First Semester course in TDC. In this context, six years means six academic sessions from the date of admission in the first semester. If any student fails to do so, he/she will have to take fresh admission in the first semester. Subject to the said condition, a student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
  - a. First semester with regular third semester examinations.
  - b. Second semester with regular fourth semester examinations
  - c. Third semester with regular fifth semester examinations.
  - d. Fourth semester with regular sixth semester examinations.



10. There shall be no scope for a student to appear as Private Candidate in any subject in TDC.

## MARKS AND EVALUATION

The evaluation of each theory paper of any semester is based on the student's performance in two examinations –

(i) Internal and (ii) External. Students' performance shall be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following

- i. Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks
- ii. External Evaluation : 80% Marks

Internal Evaluation shall be based on sessional examinations, 75% or above class attendance, home assignment, seminar and library work in each semester.

### ● PASS MARKS

The Pass Marks are as follows:

- i. Theory Paper : 30%
- ii. Practical Paper : 40%

For a student, to pass in any paper he/she should pass in both internal and external examinations of each paper (theory and practical) separately. Passing a TDC in any subject DOES NOT automatically implying "Qualifying in Honours", if any. The following rules apply for the Bachelor Degree in any subject with Honours.

- i. Simple Pass: 30% to 39% marks in aggregate i.e. from a minimum of CGPA 4.00 but less than CGPA 5.00.
- ii. Pass with Major: 40% marks or above in aggregate in Honours subjects i.e. from a minimum of CGPA 5.00.

In case, a student with Honours in any subject gets less than 40% marks in aggregate (i.e. minimum CGPA less than 5.00) in the Honours subject, but 30% or above (i.e. minimum CGPA of 4.00 or above but less than 5.00) he/she shall be declared as Simple Pass.

In case of 'Project Work', it shall be a separate paper with separately allotted marks and cannot be treated as part of any other theory/practical paper. Pass mark for project work is 50%.

### ● NUMBER OF ATTEMPTS

- i. A student who fails in one or more papers can re-appear in the said paper(s) by appearing in the next similar examination, subject to restrictions mentioned in the clause 3.
- ii. A student who has completed a semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester, irrespective of number of papers where the student failed.



- iii. In order to complete a course, a student must obtain pass marks in all the papers of TDC course.
- iv. A student having failed to fill in his examination form in the first semester, may be allowed to appear in the second semester examinations if all other eligibility criteria are fulfilled.

**BU and GU will conduct rules and regulations of the UG-CBCS courses.**

## **ADMISSION PROCEDURE :**

H.S./Degree Admission process for the new Accademic Session 2022-23 will start immediately after the declaration of HSLC/AHSEC results. Last date of submission of application form will be announced after the declaration of HSLC/AHSEC results.

1. Admission forms will be submitted online only.
2. Application form along with prospectus can be downloaded from our website ([www.goreswarcollege.ac.in](http://www.goreswarcollege.ac.in)).
3. No application form will be accepted after the last date of submission of forms.
4. Students found absent on the date of admission will not be entertained later on.
5. The admission will be given strictly on merit basis.
6. A candidate will have to submit a duly attested photocopy of the marksheet of the last qualifying examination, HSLC Admit Card., Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended testifying his/her character, caste certificate, certificate for differently abled (wherever applicable) with the application form. No other document is required with the application form.
7. There is provision of reservation of seats for the candidates belonging to the SC/ST/Tea-Tribe/EWS/OBC/MOBC and physically challenged categories as per Govt. rules.
8. A candidate must produce the following documents in original at the time of admission:
  - Marksheet and Admit Card of the last qualifying examination.
  - Two copies of recent passport size photographs.
  - A certificate from the head of the institution last attended, testifying his/her Character.
  - Relevant certificate from the competent authority (wherever necessary) for any reserve category.
  - Certificate / documents for Co-curricular activities  
(Students claiming seats against Co-Curricular category must submit a separate application in plain paper along with the admission form. Only State and National level Certificates will be entertained).
  - Gap Certificate (wherever applicable)



**However, Candidates having more than three years study gap will not be eligible for admission.**

- Admission Committee may refuse admission to a candidate whose documents are not genuine or not found to be in proper format.
  - All admissions are governed by the College Admission rules.
  - **Regarding admission, the decision of admission committee is final.**
9. No students will be allowed to get transfer to other institution after 1st Semester as per Bodoland University guidelines.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

### General Rules:

- ✓ Students admitted to this college must abide by all rules and regulations of the college. Violation of the rules i.e. irregular attendance, misconduct in any form, adopting unfair means at the examinations and the likes will be treated as serious offences leading to suspension or even expulsion from the college. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Students found indulging in such activities will be expelled from the college. Organisations, societies etc. of the students of Goreswar College, will function only under the guidance of the college authority. Only the organizations /societies recognized by the college authority will be permitted to use the facilities of the college premises.
- ✓ **College Uniform** : College Uniform is compulsory. Students, not in proper uniform, will not be allowed to enter the college premises. The uniform of the college is: For Boys: Black pants (Formal only), sky blue shirt. For Girls: Parrot Green Dokhona , White Blouse, White Phasra with green boarder/Black Salwar : Black Dupatta : Sky Blue Kameez (knee-length).
- ✓ Identity Card: Every bonafide student will be issued College identity card at the time of admission.

### Attendance Rule:

- ✓ H.S. 1st and 2nd year : **75% class attendance is mandatory for all students as per AHSEC Examination rules.** Students who do not attend at least 75% of the classes held, will not be allowed to appear in 1st year and final year examinations conducted by AHSEC.
- ✓ TDC (1st / 2nd / 3rd / 4th / 5th / 6th semesters) : A student shall not be eligible to sit for the end semester examination as a regular candidate if he / she does not attend a minimum of 75% lectures delivered in each subject separately or 6 credit per week per paper (B.U. regulation).
- ✓ All kinds of notices, banners etc. to be pasted or put up by the students, teachers, office staff or any other person (s) any where in the college shall require the permission and approval of the Principal.
- ✓ Use of Mobile Phone in college campus is strictly prohibited except under academic purpose.



- ✓ Smoking and taking alcoholic drugs are strictly prohibited in the college campus, violation of which invites strong disciplinary action.
- ✓ Any form of ragging in the college campus is strictly prohibited except under academic purpose.
- ✓ Blowing horns of any vehicle in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ✓ To keep themselves acquainted with the up-to-date information, the students must develop a habit of reading the notice boards on a daily basis.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### Students' Union :

Goreswar College Students' Union is the General Body of the students of the college. All the regular students of the college are the members of this Union. Office-Bearers of the Students' Union are elected by the students annually in an election held every year in the college for the purpose. This election is conducted by an election committee which consists of one teacher as returning officer and three other members from the teachers. The Principal reserves the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till fresh election is held.

### Suggestion/Grivance Box :

Any suggestion from the guardians/students/well wishers related to development of any aspect whatsoever of the college may be provided through the suggestion box. Students/Guardians may express their grievances in black and white and drop it in the box. These grievances will be redressed by the concerned cell which is known as the **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL** through discussion with senior faculty members.

### College Magazine :

A college magazine named "Goreswar College Magazine" is published annually with a view to giving scope for expression of the literary and creative talents of both the students and the teachers. Besides this, a few wall magazines are also being published from time to time with short periodicity.

### Students' Aid Fund :

The college has a special Aid Fund for financially poor students. This fund is created to encourage students from economically backward families who can't otherwise afford Higher Education. Entitlement to this facility is limited and subject to fulfillment of certain eligibility norms.

### Scholarship :

There is provision for the following categories of scholarships subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria :

- (i) State Merit Scholarship
- (ii) SC/ST/OBC/Tea Garden Labour Scholarship



(iii) U.G.C. sponsored Merit scholarship for students of BPL category belonging to SC/ST/OBC and Minority communities subject to the funding from UGC.

(iv) ISHAN UDAY (Spl. Scholarship for NER)

#### **Academic Calendar :**

All academic and Co-curricular activities of the college are carried on as per the Academic Calendar of Bodoland University.

#### **Support Services :**

**N.S.S. UNIT :** The college has a unit of National Service Scheme which works, in co-ordination with the controlling authority in G.U. It organizes various programmes all dedicated to community welfare in order to inculcate the sense of service to the nation in the minds of students. Dr. Ramen Medhi is associated with NSS Unit as co-ordinator who dedicatedly has been engaged in various social activities.

#### **NCC Unit :**

The 30 Assam Battalion Company, Head Quarter in Jalukbari has introduced Goreswar College NCC Unit from the Session 2020-2021. At present there are 100 cadets strength in the NCC Unit. After the TDC 1st semester admission process is over, immediately new cadets will be enrolled through selection procedure. New enrolment will be filled up as per vacancy.

Dr. Dipak Jyoti Mahanta is associated with NCC Unit as Care Taker Officer (CTO) who dedicatedly has been serving for the unit.

### **COLLEGE PREMISES AND FACILITIES :**

#### **COLLEGE LIBRARY**

The Central Library of the College has at present a stock of around 45,000 books. The working hours of the library is from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. It has a good collection of books both syllabi prescribed and other reference books. The library endeavors to meet the needs of text books for the economically backward students. Apart from the text books and reference books, the library provides several newspapers and journals on science, commerce and humanities. To provide better facilities, the library has reading rooms separately for students and teachers with sitting accommodation for 50 and 20 readers respectively at a time. At present the Library is being modernized through automation/digitalization.

Moreover, Journals and Newspapers are provided to the students & Teachers in the Library reading room.

#### **LIBRARY RULES :**

- Library cards are not transferable.



- Books are issued to students for a period of fifteen (15) days.
- Borrowers must check the physical condition of the book before getting them issued. Otherwise they will be held responsible for any damage or mutation noticed at the time of return.
- Reference books marked as restricted and bound volumes of periodicals and question papers are not issued.

## **DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY :**

The college has the provision of Departmental libraries to meet the immediate classroom needs of the departments which are maintained by the Heads of the departments. Students can avail the facilities of departmental libraries within the college hours only.

## **SPORTS FACILITIES:**

Goreswar college has a play ground within the college campus which is large enough for outdoor games like football and other field events. There is a gymnasium hall of the college which provides the students with the much needed physical exercise. There is an indoor stadium of the college also which provides for indoor facilities for Badminton Table Tennis etc. for students as well as teachers.

## **COMPUTER LAB:**

The college has a computer lab with 25 computer sets. Intending students can avail various job oriented certificate courses conducted by the Computer Education Cell from time to time. the lab is used for various course related activities.

**LANGUAGE LAB :** College has two labs under the department of English and Assamese. Now the labs are in a preliminary stage which are used to teaching-learning purpose of language.

## **AUDITORIUM HALL:**

The college has an Auditorium Hall used for holding various competitions during the annual College Week along with other cultural programmes, seminars and meetings.

## **COMMON ROOM:**

The college has provision of separate common rooms for boys and girls students.

## **DIGITAL AND SMART CLASSROOM :**

The college has a digital block comprising four digital classrooms. Modern teaching-learning equipments are available such as smart board, overhead projector, LCD monitor, sound system, smart podium etc. Teachers and learners are benefitted by using these ICT tools.

## **CONFERENCE HALL :**

The college has two modern conference hall with proper ICT facilities. One is at the ground floor of the administrative building and the other is at newly constructed top floor of the building. various interactive and awareness sessions are organised at these Hall.



### **FEEDBACK SYSTEM :**

The IQAC of the college has introduced the system of receiving online feedback of the students. The stakeholders of the college, such as students, guardians, faculty members, employees, alumni etc. are encouraged to submit their feedback online on various aspects of the college once in a year. It is expected to be more fruitful in realizing the strength and the weakness of the institution and initiating remedial measures on them. Besides these, Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) regularly conducted every year and responses are analysed in our platform.

### **PARKING SHEDS:**

The college has one shed for parking of cars of teachers and employees of the college and two bicycle sheds for students.

The college has a canteen within the campus for refreshment of students and teachers.

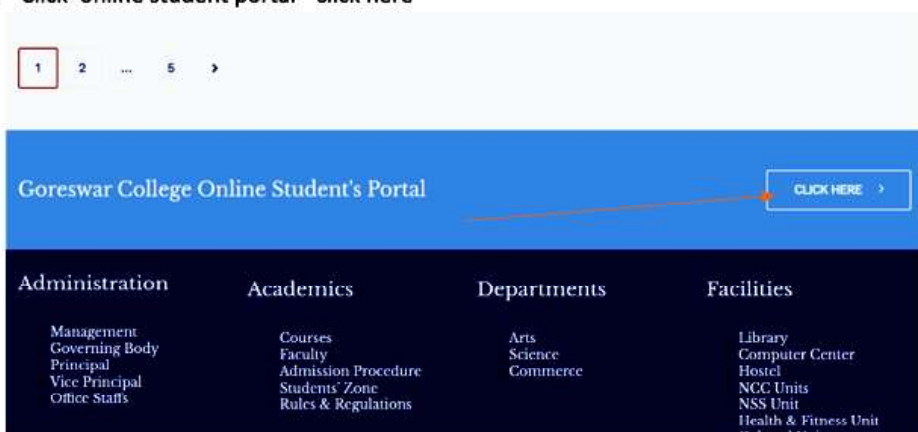

### User manual GOESWAR COLLEGE INTEGRATED MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (GCIMS)

1. **Purpose:** The objective of GCIMS is for smooth functioning of all administrative works, Accounts, Library, Functioning of Academic Departments as well as students related works of the college. In this system, the principal, faculties, employees and librarian perform respective duties and functions in an online digital mode. The function of student management is also done digitally. The students take admission and make any payment only by online mode. No cash payment is taken by the College at any cause. For this purpose, the students must have Debit Card/Credit Card/Net banking/UPI or Wallet. The GCIMS is still in a developing stage.  
The **admin** of this management system is the Principal of the College. This guideline is just for students' admission as well as other related functions in their online Account portal.
2. **Registration of New Students:**
  - 2.1. Open [www.goreswarcollege.ac.in](http://www.goreswarcollege.ac.in)
  - 2.2. Click 'online student portal'- click here



- 2.3. Fill up the 'sign up' form with correct Name, valid Mobile no.(own)., valid E-mail ID, correct Date of Birth. Then click 'sign up'.





**NB:**The student should enter his/her name, parent's name, address, date of birth(DOB) etc. as it is in the HSLC and HSSLC Registration certificate. In this system, students can generate ID card, Pass Certificate etc in their portal. If there is wrong data entered, then ID cards, Pass Certificate etc are also wrong. So, students should take utmost caution at the time of online form fill up.

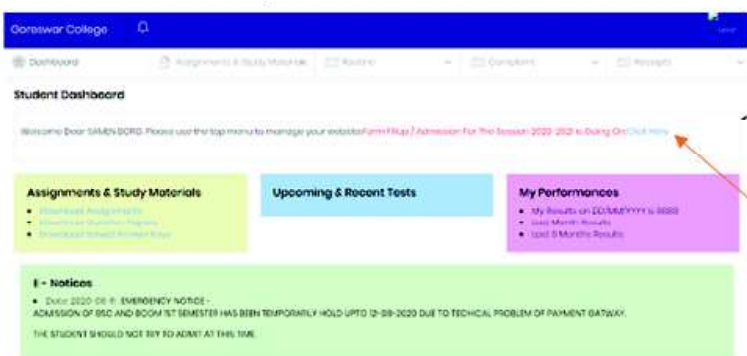
After clicking 'sign up' the student gets a SMS containing User ID and Password in his/her registered Mobile No. and in E-mail address. User Id is mobile no. and password is DOB in the format yyyy-mm-dd.

4. Then, again login using User ID and PW (click here to login). Then student gets his/her online account profile

**NB:** This is a soft password. The students are advised to change it in his/her profile with a hard PW consisting of six character (alpha numeral and special character i.e. @,#,\$) for safety of his/her online account portal. But it is also informed that if the student forgets the new PW, it is difficult to open his/her portal. So, the student should take care for it.

- 2.4.1. If the students forget password, click on 'forgot password'. An OTP goes to registered mobile no. The student can reset the password.

- 2.4.2. Click 'click here' for registration



- 2.4.3. The student gets basic details (step 1 out of 6). Enter your required data. Click 'next step'. Go on like this up to step 6. In this step 6 enter Unique ID, Bank Account, ID proof, etc. Upload required document.



- 2.4.4. Make payment using ATM cards, Credit Cards, Net banking etc. Form fills up for admission is completed. Print Registration Form and payment receipt. Submit the same to the college office.
3. The Admission Committee will verify and select the students to be admitted on the basis of merit observing all rules and regulations of the college. The merit list will be published in the college website [www.goreswarcollege.ac.in](http://www.goreswarcollege.ac.in) and in the Office notice board.
4. The online profile of the selected students will be opened for admission on the date of admission.
5. The student takes admission: -
  - 5.1. Login [www.goreswarcollege.ac.in](http://www.goreswarcollege.ac.in)
  - 5.2. Click online students' portal
  - 5.3. Leave the sign up form. Click 'sign in'.

- 5.4. Enter User ID and PW. Profile will be opened.
  - 5.5. Do as mentioned in the 2.4.1
  - 5.6. Student can see his/her basic details (step 1 out of 6) filled up form. He/she can change data if needs other than the Name, Mobile No. and Email ID. Click 'next step'
  - 5.7. Make payment using ATM cards, Credit Cards, Net banking etc.
  - 5.8. If the payment is successful the student gets SMS from payment gateway in the registered mobile no. as well as in Email ID.
  - 5.9. Print admission form and payment receipt and submit it to office if the college needs.
6. Admission for Existing Students (Renewal Admission):
- 6.1. Same procedure as mentioned in 5.1 to 5.9



**7. There are some additional manus and sub-manus in the student's portal which can be managed by students.**



- 7.1. Student can re-print his/her payment receipt, generate Identity Card, Pass Certificate from his/her portal.
- 7.2. Student can get class routine, can download any notes books uploaded by the professors from his/her portal
- 7.3. Students can view deferent NOTICES published by office of the principal and the Departments in his/her portal. So, the students should make the habit to login his/her portal at least once in a day.
- 7.4. Students can lodge complaint against any discrepancy seen in the college managing the complaint Manu.
- 7.5. Students can search essential library books and other e-materials in his/her portal without rush to the library.
